The Olympic Museum collections possess a heritage of more than **50'000** objects related to the Games:

- Posters
- Documents / papers
- Art works
- Technical equipment
- Sporting equipment
- Clothing and accessories
- Badges / pins
- Medals
- Furniture
- Flags
- Souvenirs
- Torches

Without counting about **280'000** photos and more than **14'000** hours of filmed images. You can discover part of these collections while visiting the Museum's exhibitions.

PHILATELY and NUMISMATIC

On the +1 floor of the Olympic Museum an entire room is reserved for philately and numismatic.

Here you will find more than **12'000** stamps, of which 4/5 belong to the collection of President Juan Antonio Samaranch, and more than **600** coins related to the history of the Games, of which numerous specimens are rare or even unique, such as:

For the 1896, Athens Olympic Games, a registered letter from Syros to Liverpool
or
for the 1952, Helsinki Olympic Games, a block of 12 unperforated stamps, the only block known to this day.

Family attics, basements, or bookshelves often hide "**Olympic treasures**". Gleaned over the years and generations, these objects bearing the five Olympic rings are perhaps sought-after by certain collectors. Don't forget old sporting equipment, photos or films and **bring them to the Olympic Museum**. They could perhaps complete its collections.

If you are passionate about sport and Olympism, if you search a particular object, if you are missing a piece from your collections, **discover the international collector's exchange tables**.
